## CUB SCOUT AGE REQUIREMENTS

The rules and regulations have been changed to take into account the Tiger Cub program related to boys joining the Cub Scout program. The present requirements state the following: "A Cub Scout is a boy who is either seven years of age and has completed the second grade or is eight years of age or older and is not yet eleven, or a Cub Scout is a boy who was a Tiger Cub and is seven years of age and in the second grade and who will be eight years of age by December 31." Cub Scout leaders should note the requirement.
