

CONFERENCE NLS BIG HIT

Dressed in a bright yellow and green beach shirt, sunglasses, and a tan, NLS program coordinator Michael Hoffman added some excitement to the NLS. The program started at 8:00 on Tuesday morning nd was completed with an award ceremony at 4:40 Wednesday. The participants were instructed in areas of lodge leadership; finance, program, and communications. As a special bonus for their completion of the stringent training program, the Arrowmen were presented a special black and red NLS patch made especially for the National Conference.

The attendance at the NLS was outstanding, training slots not filled by preregistration were taken on a first-come first-served basis and filled within two hours on Monday. "With the request on Monday, looked as if we could have filled 350 spots," commented Hoffman. The participants represented all six regions and over 60 lodges. A response such as this gives light to the possibility of expanding the program in the future.

Holding the NLS in a NOAC (National Order of the Arrow Conference) setting like this created a unique opportunity to experiment with new training ideas. "We've used a new participant workbook" continues Hoffman, "Also new teaching techinques that help the trainer interact more." These special programs will be reviewed by the National Committee for consideration of implementing them into the regular program.

Ordeal candidates that did not make the past Ordeal weekend have this last chance to complete the Ordeal!


