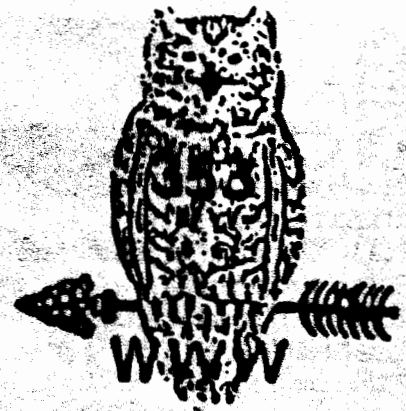

The Order has been busy collecting money towards the \$100,000 commitment made to the National Scouting Museum in Murray, Ky.

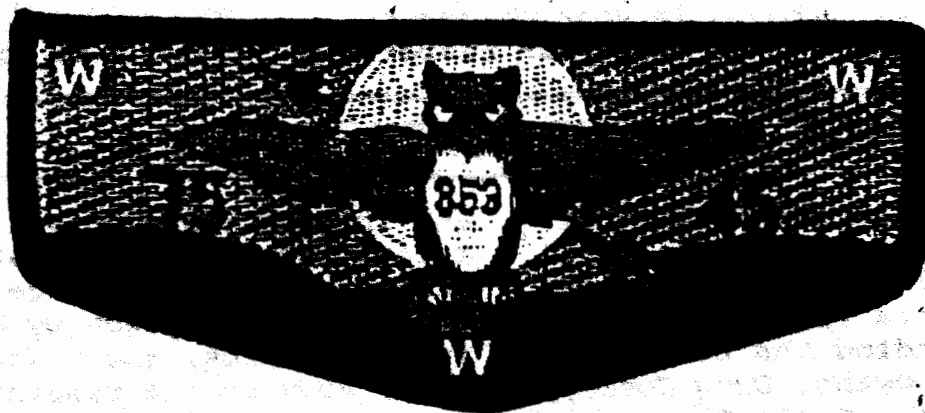
Contributions have been coming in to the National Office.
